FIRST ANNUAL HANA NEIGHBORHOOD GARAGE SALE

FRI, MAY 13 • SAT, MAY 14 • SUN, MAY 15



If you're like me, and have more clutter than the house can hold, this May might just be the answer, as HANA hosts the first annual Neighborhood Garage Sale.

This was an idea first proposed by Patty Brauer last fall, who I am sure is sorry she ever mentioned it - as we have put her in charge.

Here's how it works:

- On Fri., May 13, Sat. May 14, and Sun. May 15, any family in the HANA neighborhood who wants to participate holds their own garage sale.
- You can participate on one day or all days, whatever you like. The time has been left open, but we suggest 9 am to 3 pm as a general guideline.

So what does HANA provide, you ask? Well, mostly coordination and advertising. HANA will be placing a nice ad in the Daily Herald Neighbor and Classified sections on Thu, May 12 through Sun, May 15.

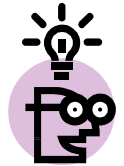
We have also details, maps, and directions on the HANA web site.

In addition, Picket Fence Realty has agreed to help us out by mentioning our garage sale in their May 7 Daily Herald

ad as well as a 16-page publication they produce. They have also agreed to procure and place over 30 "Garage Sale" signs around the HANA neighborhood.

HINTS & TIPS

- Start collecting stuff now. *Don't wait until the last minute.* Price it now, too!
- Don't have enough stuff? Combine with a neighbor. Make sure to mark stuff so you know whose is whose.
- Since HANA is not providing individual signs, it's up to you to make your sale visible to passers-by! Be creative: neon signs, flags on a string, balloons, banners, etc.
- Provide free water or let the kids sell lemonade or cans of cold soda from a cooler.
- Put your checkout table at the end of the driveway to discourage people from "forgetting" to pay. Also, do not put money in a cashbox - use a money apron or fanny pack. Put your calculator and cell phone in there, too.
- Don't mow your lawn the day before the sale (lest your buyers get covered in clippings); don't let your dog outside on the day of the sale.
- Save plastic bags from the grocery store for buyers to put their purchases in. If you are selling clothes, use dry cleaner hangers so the buyers can keep them.
- Go to your bank and get plenty of change beforehand. As a rule of thumb: (2) \$10, (4) \$5, (25) \$1, 1 roll each of quarters, nickels, and dimes.
- If you are selling anything electrical (lamps, radios, etc.), have a working extension cord or outlet strip so buyers can test to see if the item works.
- Soothing easy-listening or classical music can be very pleasant and invites buyers to linger.
- Finally - have fun, and gab with your neighbors!

DEVILED EGGS

7 large eggs, cold
3/4 t. Country-style Dijon mustard
3 T. mayonnaise
1 1/2 t. cider vinegar
1/4 t. Worcestershire sauce
Salt and pepper

Place eggs in saucepan, cover w/ 1 inch of water, bring to boil over high heat. Remove pan from heat, let stand 10 min. Remove eggs to ice water bath, let stand 5 min. Peel eggs, slice in half lengthwise.

Remove yolks to small bowl. Mash yolks with fork until no large lumps remain. Add mustard, mayonnaise, vinegar, and Worcestershire, and salt and pepper to taste. Mix with rubber spatula, mashing against sides of bowl until smooth.

Fill egg halves with yolk mixture. Sprinkle with paprika and / or cayenne pepper.
