



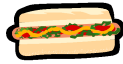

## TURKEY JERKY TREATS FOR DOGS

- 1 lb. ground turkey (or chicken or beef)
- 3 t. teriyaki sauce (use low sodium, especially for older dogs)
- 1 to 2 cloves garlic
- 1/2 t. ginger

Preheat the oven to the lowest setting (150° to 170°). Mix all ingredients and spread thinly onto a cookie sheet.

Place in the oven and bake for two hours. During baking, keep the oven door propped open.

After two hours, remove the jerky from the oven and blot any grease with paper towels. Slice the jerky into 1-2 inch strips. Turn the slices over and return to the oven and bake two more hours.

Allow them to cool, then store in the freezer.
