HANA NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH

HANA would like to thank all those who attended our first Neighborhood Watch meeting on April 24. Many thanks also go to Officer Doug Hajek of the AHPD for an excellent presentation on burglary statistics for our area and many useful tips on how to protect ourselves and our homes from crime.



So What is Neighborhood Watch?

Neighborhood Watch is a group of neighbors who look out for each other's families and property, alert the police to any suspicious activities or crime in progress, and work together to make the community a safer and better place to live.

What is HANA's Involvement?

HANA has appointed a committee of volunteers to drive the HANA Neighborhood Watch program. The Neighborhood Watch Committee (NWC) is charged with providing educational materials and assistance in community awareness. But the real involvement and commitment needs to come from everyone in the neighborhood.

How Can I Participate?

You can help to keep our neighborhood safe in many ways:

- Make your home and property as burglar-proof as possible by contacting the AHPD for a FREE security survey. Contact Doug Hajek, AHPD Crime Prevention Officer at 847-368-5330 for a personal onsite inspection of your home and property.
- Report any suspicious activity on your property or your neighbor's by calling 911. "If you think it's probably nothing, then it's possibly something." The AHPD would rather check out a potential crime than deal with one after the fact.
- Request a copy of Officer Hajek's crime prevention tips and Community Service Information hand-out. Contact Barbara Doulas at HANA Neighborhood Watch (see contact info below.)
- Attend future presentations on home and personal safety sponsored by HANA Neighborhood Watch.
- Volunteer to participate on the HANA Neighborhood Watch. Contact Barbara Doulas (see contact info below.)

What's Next?

The HANA NWC is an ongoing effort. The committee will continue to provide tips, information and training on home and personal safety. Watch for future contributions to the HANA newsletter and upcoming notices and announcements on training sessions and public awareness events. In addition, you'll soon be seeing neighborhood watch signage which the committee will be posting around HANA's boundaries.

During the spring and summer months, when children are outside more, there are some important safety tips to keep in mind regarding vehicle safety.

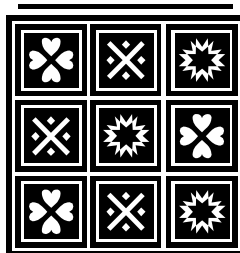

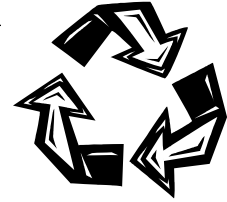

THE GREENING OF HANA



Wherever you look these days, people are taking small steps to reduce their carbon footprint. Every weekday morning, fewer cars are on the road as many children walk to school. The recent neighborhood garage sale points to the fact that more and more people try to reuse rather than buy new. Even your HANA newsletter is printed on 30% recycled paper. And now you can even find a recycling bin at Festival Park.

A recent exploratory glance into the new recycling bin revealed that there is much confusion over the difference between recyclable vs. non-recyclable materials. As you sort your trash, either at Festival Park or in your home, this chart should help clarify which items can be recycled.

Recyclables
all paper (magazines, junk mail, phone books, etc.)
all paperboard (cereal boxes, tissue boxes, pizza boxes, etc.)
all plastics # 1-7 (look for recyclable triangle symbol)
metal (aluminum cans and foil, aerosol cans, steel or tin cans)
cardboard (flattened)
Styrofoam with recyclable triangle symbol

Some other points to remember:

- All recyclable items can be commingled in one container.
- You can recycle food-contaminated items after disposing of excess food/liquids. There is no need to rinse recyclables except to control odor and vermin.
- If in doubt, recycle. Non-recyclable items will be removed at the transfer station.

Anything left along the parade route before 7:00 pm will be confiscated by the AH Police Department.
