Please be courteous to your neighbors on the 4th of July parade route. Spots should not be reserved until 7:00 pm the night before the parade. Anything left along the parade route before 7:00 pm will be confiscated by the VAH Police Department.

Each July 4th, thousands of people (mostly children and teens) are injured while using consumer fireworks. Although Illinois allows for the use of sparklers, snake/glow worm pellets, smoke devices, trick noisemakers, and plastic or paper caps, please be sure they are used with adult supervision. Illinois law specifically prohibits use of firecrackers, torpedoes, skyrocketes, roman candles, and "bombs."

ARLINGTON HEIGHTS COOL CITY COALITION

Cool cities have made a commitment to curb global warming by signing the U.S. Mayors' Climate Protection

Agreement. Begun in 2005 by the Sierra Club, the Cool Cities campaign empowers city residents and local leaders to join and encourage their cities to implement smart energy solutions to save money and build a cleaner future.

The Arlington Heights Cool Cities Coalition presented the agreement to reduce carbon emissions below 1990 levels to Mayor Arlene Mulder on Feb. 16. The coalition is working to make Arlington Heights the 40th Illinois city to sign the agreement and make an impact at a local, grass roots level.

The Arlington Heights Cool Cities Coalition is following the national initiative's five milestones:

1. Establish the Cool Cities Campaign (completed)
2. Engage the Community (ongoing)
3. Municipality Signs the Commitment Agreement
4. Implement Initial Solution Steps
5. Implement Advanced Smart Energy Solutions

Becoming a Cool City opens up a host of federal and corporate grants available for reducing carbon emissions locally and improving our air quality.

SUMMER SAFETY TIPS



Summer is the time when many people travel on vacation. Preventing crime while you're away starts with making it look like you've never left. To protect your home before you leave,

- Keep shades and blinds in their normal positions.
- Put several household lights on timers so they turn on and off at appropriate times.
- Put a television or radio on a timer (so it appears as if someone were home).
- Install switches with timers for your exterior lights or motion detecting lighting.
- Arrange to have grass mowed while you're gone.
- Activate your home alarm if you have one.
- Ask a neighbor to park in your driveway overnight to suggest someone is home.
- Ask someone to pick up your mail and newspaper every day or have delivery stopped. Don't let it pile up!
- Make sure all door and window locks are in working order, and **lock them all when you leave**, particularly the connecting door to an attached garage.

If you come home and see a broken window, an open door, or a slit screen, don't go in. Confronting a burglar can be dangerous. Phone 911 immediately!

Also, remember to look out for your neighbors this summer, especially if they're traveling. Call the police if you see anything suspicious.

VAH HISTORY: THE FIRST HOME IN ARLINGTON HEIGHTS

The history of Arlington Heights began in 1836 when Asa Dunton, a stonemason from Oswego, NY, brought his wife Lois Hawkes Dunton and their six children to the Illinois prairie. Asa staked three claims of 160 acres each, at \$1.25 an acre, for himself and his two sons, William and James. The first building in Arlington Heights was the home built by Asa's son William in 1845 for his bride, Almeda Wood Dunton. The home was not a log cabin, but a two-story frame house located on the west side of State Road (now Arlington Heights Road). In 1853, William sold 16 acres of his property to the Illinois and Wisconsin Railroad for \$250. He moved his home out of the path of the railroad farther north and to

the east side of State Road, where it remained for 50 years. The house was moved a second time in 1905 to 112 E. Wing to make room for a home for William's son, George. When State Road was widened in 1935, the home was moved a final time to a turkey farm at 705 E. Hintz. In 1968, the 123-year history of the home came to an end when it was demolished and replaced by a housing development.
