SINGLE-SERVING LIQUOR SALES ISSUE

The VAH Committee of the Whole is expected to discuss and vote on a proposal banning the sale of single-serving alcohol products on **Monday, Oct. 12, at 7:30 pm**. The proposed ban, similar to ones enacted in other towns, was developed in response to citizen complaints about public intoxication in the downtown area, including Memorial Park and Arlington Heights Memorial Library in HANA.

The Arlington Heights Police Department (AHPD) developed the proposal when they identified the sale and abuse of single-serving liquor as a key contributor to a pattern of unlawful behavior, including fighting, theft, public urination and defecation, disorderly conduct, criminal damage to property, litter from empty single-serving bottles and cans, and threats.

A coalition of liquor store owners is reported to have gathered 3,000 signatures objecting to the ordinance. The liquor store owners believe that banning the sale of certain products will disrupt sales and cause store closings. The owners feel that education of license holders and the possible development of a “no service list” should be sufficient to prevent future problems. The AHPD does not agree.

If you are interested in this issue and/or would like to speak on this issue, HANA recommends that you attend the VAH Committee of the Whole meeting at Village Hall on **Monday, Oct. 12, at 7:30 pm**.

NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH SIGNS

We have good news to report on HANA’s efforts to post Neighborhood Watch signs, which have been shown to deter criminals. HANA’s Neighborhood Watch sign proposal (developed with the Arlington Heights Police Department) was approved by the VAH Public Works. Additionally, HANA was awarded a grant to cover the cost of purchasing the Neighborhood Watch signs. Thanks to Barbara Doulas, the Neighborhood Watch Committee, and Officer Hajek for their hard work on this project!

CITIZEN OBSERVER ALERT NETWORK

This summer, one watchful local resident played a key role in apprehending a man who was approaching children while impersonating a police officer. This resident recognized the offender and vehicle from CitizenObserver Alert descriptions and contacted the police.
